These figures show the number of pupils with autism currently known to education departments compared prevalence estimates from the Autism Strategy.

There would appear to be a close relationship between the numbers, indicating that Autism appears to be relatively well identified within the school system.

The figures for adults with autism known to social work are significantly smaller than both the number of children with autism and the prevalence estimates from the Autism Strategy.

To a degree this is to be expected as many adults with autism require no support or additional help. However it is likely that some of the adults who need help may not be getting it.

One of the ways that we might be able to judge the work in supporting transitions for young people to adult services, is if there is a continuing increase in the numbers known to social work faster than any pace of increase in the number of young people known to education.
